- Signs and symptoms of exacerbation are explained.
- Education is provided on keeping a daily weight log and the importance of its use. Your nurse will review this log during your home visits.
- Prescribed diets are reviewed.
- Nutrition education provided.
- Smoking cessation is discussed if needed.
- Information is given at the time of discharge on the importance of continued compliance, communication with physician, heart resource groups and outpatient classes at Mercy Hospital.
