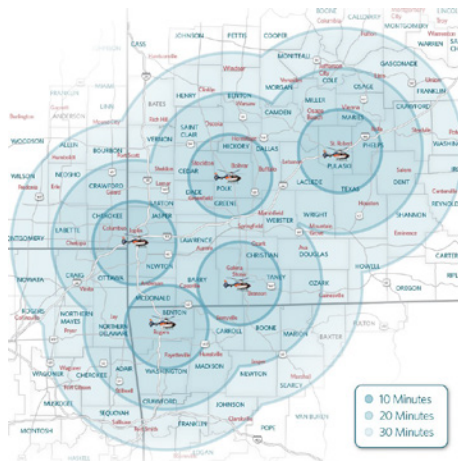

Experience and Safety

Mercy Life Line has flown more than 30,000 accident-free missions since its beginning in 1984. It is the most experienced air ambulance service in the four-state region and has the most accident-free air ambulance hours.

Mercy's Emergency Services Communication Center provides dispatching and flight following services for Life Line from a 12 seat communication center. The center is an Accredited Center of Excellence (ACE) as designated by the International Academy Emergency Dispatch.

Mercy Life Line is certified by the Commission on Accreditation of Medical Transport Systems. CAMTS is dedicated to improving the quality of patient care and safety of the transport environment for services providing rotorwing, fixed wing and ground transport systems.



Aircraft Technology

Mercy operates five Airbus H135p2+ twin engine aircraft that are able to transport patients at an average speed of 150 miles per hour. Mercy Life Line operates the region's only Instrument Flight Rules (IFR) flight program. Our helicopters' instrument certification allows us to fly in a wider spectrum of weather conditions. In addition, Mercy Life Line has the region's only hospital helipad GPS network.

The Flight Team

Mercy Life Line's flight team consists of experienced and dedicated pilots, nurses and certified flight paramedics. All flight nurses and paramedics are experienced in pre-hospital and inter-facility critical care transport. Progressive protocols and ongoing competencies in advanced airway procedures, cardiac, stroke, trauma, burn, neonatal, pediatric and obstetrical are provided to the flight crew.

- Intra-aortic balloon pump (Datascope and Impella)
- Neonatal Isolette utilized by Mercy Kids Transport Team, specializing in neonatal/pediatric transfers
